



Outgoing secretary reflects on MHI involvement

VOLUNTEER PROFILE: KIMBERLY WALKER

OTTAWA | I think I was meant to find MHI and be a part of it for these last six years. The path hasn't been straight - it wandered about, but in the end, I'm here. I've often felt (and said) that affordable housing was responsible for bringing many good things to my life. I learned the value of really helping others, that I have a voice and something to say, that I can leave things better than I found them. So that is what I've worked toward, sometimes with more success than other times. How did I come to MHI? This is a nice story. It was a connection that ran from Fran Klodawsky to a student of hers and a co-worker of mine named Lenore, brought to me as a gift by my nice husband, Matthew. Lenore heard from Fran over a lunch that she needed a geographer to teach a class. Lenore said she knew of someone, so I passed Matthew's information on. After class one day, Fran asked Matthew if he knew of anyone with board experience in affordable housing. And he did.

So, coming to MHI is really a longer story – as they often are. I did have experience with boards and affordable housing. In high school, I volunteered

to clean apartments for elderly tenants living in a Housing Authority of Portland (HAP) senior highrise. This was before universal design, so if the tenants were not able to clean well enough, they were at risk of losing their housing. Fifteen years later and suddenly on my own, I moved into a HAP family housing complex with three little children. Then I started a tenants' union to start turning a housing complex into a community and make our voices heard by our landlord. I was heard by the mayor of Portland, who appointed me to HAP's board of commissioners. When Fran called me to see if I would like to meet and talk about MHI, I was so excited. I did my homework and MHI seemed exactly right. At the annual general meeting, I met Executive Director Suzanne Le. and introduced myself around to members and chatted. I remember that everyone was very kind and very smart and very committed. I remember feeling at home. My term as a member of the MHI Board will end soon, so I'd like to thank the MHI community for your kindness, support and encouragement in my work here.

- Purpose: Work in a team to help with property maintenance at the Haven.
- Duties include: Unit preparations, painting, cleaning, carpentry, and general handy work.

Membership & Outreach Committee

- Purpose: Serve on a committee to promote MHI membership and outreach.
- Duties include: Facilitating MHI engagement within the faith communities through an annual membership drive; outreach activities such as presentations, public forums, and special events.

Tenant Relations Team

- Purpose: The Resident Relations Committee (RRC) is a volunteer group concerned with supporting and addressing tenant concerns at MHI. We also work to enhance neighbourly relations within our buildings and within the community.
- Duties include: Contacting and meeting with new tenants to welcome them to our buildings; attending meetings once a month to contribute towards a positive life experience for our tenants; directing tenants to information and resources as needed, and maintaining a supportive connection during their tenancy, particularly during times of difficulty.
