\$2.3 MILLION REQUIRED FOR VETERANS' HOUSE

Roughly 80% of necessary funds raised for 40-unit project

ROCKCLIFFE PARK – Multifaith Housing Initiative (MHI) is four-fifths of the way to completing its fundraising for Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building. However, that means there's still an additional \$2.3 million left to collect in order to complete the 40-unit residence. "We've received fantastic support thus far, but the fact of the matter remains that we still need to raise \$2.3 million," said Suzanne Le, Executive Director of MHI. "We're calling on our supporters, our long-time donors, and the faith community to do what they've always done when we're pushing forward during a fundraising campaign – open their hearts and their wallets and help us over the finish line."

'WE'RE GOING TO HAVE TO PUSH HARD'

Veterans' House is the fifth affordable housing project of MHI. Scheduled to open around Remembrance Day 2020, Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building will provide supportive housing for men and women who have served in the Canadian Armed Forces, are either homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

"I'm hoping as many people as possible can make a contribution toward Veterans' House this Christmas, so that 2019 will hopefully be the last holiday season these veterans will spend without a permanent roof over their heads," said Le. "That thought is keeping our staff, board and volunteers motivated."

She noted that MHI has been able to reach new supporters for Veterans' House due to connections from the military community, as well as media coverage received throughout 2019.

However, she noted that the interest needs to translate into actual fundraising dollars. "We need help from both new and former supporters to raise that \$2.3 million," she noted. 

'IT'S THE QUICKEST, EASIEST WAY TO GIVE'

For 'fuss free' \$20 Veterans' House donation, text VETERANS2020 to 41010

OTTAWA – Making a donation to Veterans' House is faster than ever, thanks to MHI's new text-to-give program.

By texting the word VETERANS2020 to 41010, donors can give \$20 directly to the Veterans' House campaign in mere seconds.

"It's the quickest, easiest way to give to Veterans' House," explained Sheldon Leong, Manager of Fund Development at MHI. "It literally takes 15 seconds. You just open a new text message, type in 41010, and then press 'send.' You'll receive a message asking if you want to continue in English or French. After you respond, you'll get a second message

asking you to confirm your \$20 donation by replying with the word 'YES.' It's that simple - \$20 will be added directly to your phone bill." Donors will receive a separate confirmation message with additional instructions to download an online tax receipt if they wish.

'Text to give is fuss free'

Amanda Smith-Millar, Manager of Communications at MHI, said she's found that text-to-give is a handy way to receive donations from people who express a passing interest in supporting MHI.

"If I'm chatting with someone at a bus stop or family get-together, and the subject of work comes up, I'll often mention Veterans' House. If they seem inclined to help and I spot a phone in their hand, it's a great opportunity to say, 'Well, we have text to give.... You can make a donation right now if you want!' Most people who are in a financial position to support charities are happy to part with \$20 on the spot when they know it's for a good cause... and they leave the conversation knowing they brought MHI a little bit closer to our \$2.3-million goal. Text to give is fuss free – you don't have to make an account or download an app, and 41010 won't send donors marketing emails after they make a donation."

Smith-Millar noted that text-to-give only allows for donations of \$20.



DID YOU KNOW?

Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building is going to built on the former Canadian Forces Base Rockcliffe in Ottawa, Canada. The military presence was terminated in the 1990s, and ownership of the land was transferred to the Canada Lands Company until MHI eventually assumed ownership of the property.





What is Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell

Building? Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building is a housing community for veterans who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. The facility will provide supportive housing for 40 veterans. The site is located on Mikinak Road on the site of the former CFB Rockcliffe Airbase. Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building will offer mental health and addiction services; gathering spaces (including a communal kitchen and outdoor barbecue facilities); an indoor gym; and a dog park for service dogs. Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building will be the fifth affordable housing project of Multifaith Housing Initiative (MHI), an Ottawa-based charitable not-for-profit that provides affordable housing to those in need. It will be MHI's first project dedicated to housing veterans.

What is Multifaith Housing Initiative?

Multifaith Housing Initiative (MHI) is an Ottawa-based registered charity that provides and promotes safe, affordable, and well-maintained housing in inclusive communities and mobilizes resources for these purposes. MHI was established in 2002 after religious leaders in the broader Ottawa region realized that the city suffered from a significant shortage of affordable housing, and teamed up to try to address the problem.

Today, MHI's membership consists of approximately 80 faith groups, including congregations from the Baha'i, Christian, Hindu, Jewish, and Muslim communities. MHI currently has 139 rental units that house between 300 and 400 residents at any given time. MHI has four affordable housing sites:

- Kent House. located in Centretown
- Blake House. located in Vanier
- **Somerset Gardens**, located in Centretown (MHI owns 10 condo units there)
- **The Haven**, our most recent completed project, located in Barrhaven.

How is Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building different from MHI's previous projects? Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building will be different from Kent House, Blake House, Somerset Cardens, and the Haven in two ways:

1) Veterans only: Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building will be different from MHI's other four sites because its tenants will be veterans. The other MHI sites are not designed specifically for veterans. Kent, Blake, and Somerset Gardens are open to individuals/families that meet low-income requirements. At the Haven and Somerset

Gardens, 80% of units are for low-income individuals/families, while the remaining 20% of units are rented out at regular market rates.)

2) Supportive housing: MHI's four existing sites offer affordable housing only. Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building will offer supportive housing services – including counselling, mental health services etc. – that

counselling, mental health services etc. - that are tailored to the needs of each veteran. These services will be administered by Ottawa Salus with caseworker support from Veterans' Affairs Canada.

When will Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building open? Veterans' House is tentatively scheduled to open November 2020. How do prospective applicants sign up to become a resident of Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building? MHI is working with local shelters, Ottawa Salus, the Royal Canadian Legion, Veterans Affairs Canada, and other key stakeholder groups to develop an efficient, effective, and fair identification, prioritization, and intake process for future residents. MHI recently hosted a charrette on Dec. 9, 2019 to begin the preliminary pocress of figuring out how the application process will be designed and implemented.

Do you have to be religious to live at an MHI site, or to volunteer with MHI? No. The

"multifaith" aspect of MHI simply refers to the fact that our voting members consist of faith groups. (Faith communities pay a \$100 membership fee each year; in return, they are invited to appoint a representative from their congregation to vote at MHI's Annual General Meeting.)

Who is Andy Carswell, and why did MHI name the facility after him? Four years ago.

Toronto resident John Carswell - President of Canso Investment Counsel - made a lead gift to MHI on behalf of the Carswell family to help build a community for homeless veterans. The building has been named Veterans' House: the Andy Carswell Building in honour of John's father, Squadron Leader (ret'd)

Andrew (Andy) Carswell, AFC, CD. Andy, now aged 96, is a Second World War veteran of the Royal Canadian Air Force, and was stationed at CFB Rockcliffe after the war.

Canso Investment Counsel made the second lead gift to Veterans' House in 2018. Canso Investment Counsel is named after an airplane Sqn. Leader Carswell flew during his time with the military. In recognition of the company's donation, MHI named the site of Veterans' House the Canso Campus.
